
Maths: Talk Time



Look around your house for clocks and ask a member of your household to test your time knowledge. Can you tell the time on an analogue, digital and 24hour clock? How many time challenges can you get correct? Is there anything you need to work on?

Reading:

It is so important to your learning that you **READ EVERYDAY FOR AT LEAST 20 MINUTES**. You can read books you have at home, you can read recipes and you can listen to audio books or have someone read to you. It doesn't how, when or where you read as long as you read. Ask a member of your household to ask you ERIC questions (See attached).



Physical Activity and Well-being:

Have a go at this circuit. Follow the instructions as carefully as you can. You could challenge someone in your household to do it with you. (See attached).



Writing:

Write a set of instructions which teach people one way of looking after the environment (e.g. 'How to save water' or 'How to recycle your rubbish'). Remember to tell me why it is important to save water or recycle.



Virtue: Kindness

Kindness is doing something for someone else without wanting anything in return. What can you do this week that is kind? You could leave out sugar and water for hungry butterflies or bird seed for hungry birds.




Speaking and Listening:

Take your time this is harder than you think!




Outdoor Learning:


Maths problem

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Recycled Tin Wind Chime

To make a Recycled Wind chime out of tins you will need:

- Paint/ sharpies
- String
- Hammer and nail
(ask an adult to do this bit)
- Clean tins *(ask an adult to wash and check for sharp edges)*

1. First decorate your tins.
2. Ask an adult to hammer a nail through

the top of the tin to make a hole.

3. Tie the string in a knot at the end and thread through the tin.
4. Hang all the tins at different lengths.
5. Put up and enjoy!
