Great thanks to Mrs Storey and Mrs Popperwell for allowing us to play in this immense tournament.

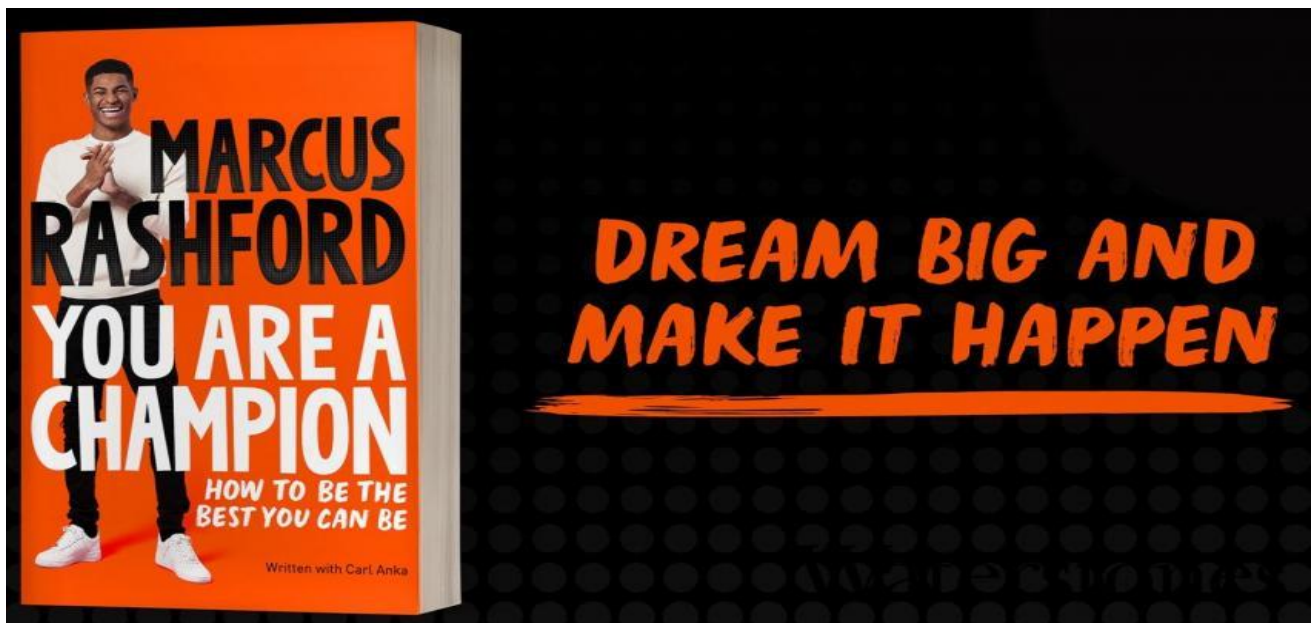
Thank you to Miss Cornell for driving St Day girls to Redruth school and back safely, also for being our audience and supporting us.

And a massive congratulations to the St Day football girls on your amazing victory, you have made the school very proud. WELL DONE!'

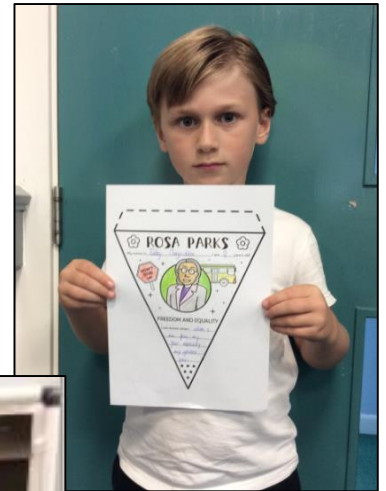
