Next week, Yr 6 children will return for the slightly longer hours of 9.00am – 1.00pm to include staying for lunch – please read the email for Yr 6 families. As this week has been so successful, we will be offering a similar package to children in **Reception for the week beginning: 29<sup>th</sup> June Year 1 for the week beginning: 6<sup>th</sup> July** 

# A letter and risk assessment will be sent to you. To be able to plan for this, we will need an expression of interest from you by 12.00 Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> June to guarantee a place in a small 'bubble' group.

This decision remains firmly with families. If your child comes to school, we will be accessing the same learning that we send home to you on a weekly basis, on the website.

Our priority is still to go slow and steady following the latest scientific advice and hopefully build up to welcoming every child back before we officially close for the summer break – even if only for a transition day. We feel this would enable every child to have some closure, see their friends, see that we are still here and that school is a safe place to be especially in anticipation for a September return. It was clear that our Yr 6 children were nervous on the Monday and we were quickly able to support them by giving them opportunities to talk about their experiences.

Due to the complexities of staffing, a growing 'key worker' group and in response to any changing government advice, we need to review our offer of provision on a weekly basis. Our risk assessment is 'dynamic' and subject to change.
