There was a real buzz of excitement in the air on the first day back to school as children discovered our fabulous new climbina eauipment. After а safety talk and demonstration, the children wasted no time in tackling the climbing wall and the traversing forest. Climbing on this type of equipment can benefit our children in so many positive ways. For example; encouraging imaginative play, solving, social negotiation problem and



interaction, physical development, brain development and personal awareness. Huge thanks must go to all 'The Friends of St Day and Carharrack' volunteers for raising the funds over the years and contributing £2,000 to this project. We are very grateful to our parents and friends who arrange enrichment activities for our community and parents who come and spend money to support us. The large wooden climbing frame on the field is being enjoyed at lunchtime thanks to you all- and under your parental supervision it can be enjoyed after school until 4.00pm. The children had a wonderful time wandering round the Rainforest biome looking at banana, pineapple, cinnamon, cacao and lemongrass plants. KS1 and 2 classes enjoyed an assembly on Roald Dahl Day that was full of pops, bangs and whizzes! *Year 5 and 6 need to be confident with all times tables, inverse calculations and able to apply this knowledge to solve problems.
