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Dear Families



As Michael Morpurgo says, "*Reading is the one ability, that once set in motion, has the ability to feed itself, grow exponentially and provide a basis from which possibilities are limitless.*"

Good readers learn more: the more they know, the easier it is for them to learn. The research proves that children who choose to read a lot at home do well at school. Please support us by developing good

reading routines at home and ensuring your children arrive with their reading book and record every day. Given the pull on children's time from TV, ipads and computers we need to be better at storytelling than we've ever been before. Don't beg children to read a story with you – show them that storytime is absolutely the best time of day and a total treat – for both of you!



PUNCTUALITY MATTERS

Please be on time to ensure your child does not miss out on their daily entitlement to key reading skills development. We open the school doors from 8.45am – 8.55am to help with the school drop off. The gates will be locked promptly at 8.55am. After that time, if your child enters through the office it will be recorded as a 'late mark' as registers will be closed.
