To congratulate all of our children we are investing in a range of activities at lunchtimes and break times to ensure everyone is engaged and there is a range of activities available. Our new Sports Leaders above will be giving freely of their time to help everyone enjoy lunchtimes. Mr Ayres came in to tell us all about our fantastic new Sports Council and Active Club. Twenty amazing children from years 4 and 5 have been carefully selected to be Sports Leaders and form our **Sports Council**. Every day, four of these children will lead an activity in the KS1 playground. They will be responsible for organising their equipment, setting up the activity and teaching the KS1 children. Mr Ayres will meet with our Sports Leaders every week to teach them new skills, help them prepare their equipment bags and help them be exceptional leaders. In addition to this, these children will meet once a month as the Sports Council with Mr Ayres and Miss Popperwell to discuss sport and active play in our school.

The child-led nature of loose parts in combination with children's creativity and inventiveness results in endless different ways of using the equipment so all ages, genders and abilities find ways to play and socialise together.
