
Dear Families,


This week’s special days to note:

Activity of the week to try at home!

Tricky Word Hunt



Tricky or key words are words within each phase that are not phonetically decodable (you can sound them out) and your child will just have to learn by sight.

This is a really easy activity to set up and should keep them occupied for a good while. A great way to prompt their recognition. Put out lots of different books not just children’s books (you might want to avoid the 50 shades though 😂) for your child to explore. You could also have magazines, leaflets or takeaways menus that they have to search for the tricky words in. Once they’ve spotted a word they tick the sheet.

This term I am going to trial a borrowing system whereby you can borrow some of the games we use in school to take home and play at home.
