Homework

Please keep reading stories, looking at phonics cards and learning tricky words e.g. the, to, I. Children will need some normality over the Christmas period and this is just the thing to ground those busy minds. Thank you!

Activity of the week to try at home!

Steps to Phonics Success!

A simple activity that helps develop the skill of segmenting and blending. If you don't mind stick small bits of masking tape on each step of the staircase and write the graphemes for words on each. Leave a blank step after every word and this indicates that your child needs to blend the sounds together to make the word. If you don't have steps just put the pieces on the floor somewhere for the children to read.



I Spy Box

A really simple one to set up if you have a transparent plastic box and some whiteboard pens. A great activity to help your child identify initial sounds,



recognise and form letters but easily adapted to suit the phase your child is working by altering the items inside. I just placed a few items from around the house inside the upturned plastic box, put out a couple of whiteboard pens and some letter cards to help with identification and formation. Your child looks inside the box, chooses an object that they can see and listens for the initial sound. They can then practise writing the letter on the outside of the box with the whiteboard pens. For children working in the higher phases place objects inside the box that are decodable for the phase they are working and they can write the whole word on the box.

Common Exception words: the I to love

We are adding the word 'love' to the list because we are writing cards and letters in class.

New Read Write Inc sounds to learn this week:

RWInc sounds learnt: m a s d t l p n p g o c k u b h l f r j v w qu y z x th sh ch

We have **completed** all the 'single' set one sounds! Now we are learning 'special friends sh, ch, th, ng, nk'. Once we have done these letter sounds we will begin Set 2 sounds. Children are beginning to take home sound blending books to read with you at home. Please let them share these with you at home. Don't forget to record this on BOOM READER. This can be as simple as –"Heard H read" or "Used sounds fluently and quickly to read easily".

The books look a little like this:



Please support your children with this at home as much as you can. The more you do at home, the more confident they will be in school.
