Good attendance is vital for learning. The national minimum expectation is set at 96%. Please help us achieve this and support your child's learning. A reminder that the school day starts at **8.55am for everyone and ends at 3.10pm.** Our doors open at 8.45am to enable everyone to be on time. If your child is arriving later than 8.55 am, they will receive a 'late mark' which can contribute to 'unauthorised absence' and involvement from the Education Welfare Officer.

Breakfast club is open from 8.00am every day to support parents with breakfast, childcare and getting your children to school on time. If your child receives Pupil Premium funding, we can support with costs for this club. We have the EWO in school this week and will update parents on new strategies to raise the whole school percentage so we are in line with national expectations of 96% as this ensures the best outcomes for your children now and in the future.
