FOREST SCHOOLS



Forest Schools is up and running! Our children have been learning about making fires safely – toasting marshmallows and making bread over the fire. This is a great opportunity to get outdoors and develop positive relationships with each other and our environment.

For anyone who has not heard of it, Forest School is a form of outdoor education that promotes learning about nature and the

woodland habitat. It also has the added benefit of encouraging children to work together to solve problems and overcome challenges. Forest School activities can include fire lighting, building shelters and using tools such as saws and loppers. Playing games to promote enjoyment and awareness of the setting is also a big feature during sessions. At St Day and Carharrack, our aim is to build up Forest School activities so that children can increase their enjoyment and learn more from the sessions, to do this we are currently looking for funding to purchase suitable equipment. **To help us** it would be fantastic if anyone with old and **unwanted wellies, waterproof clothing** or other similar items could donate them to school so we can be equipped for all weather situations! SPARKLE - our Model of Learning

S - Supportive Learning

We recognise that in order for children to be able to learn they must be in a comfort zone where their emotional and physical needs are met. All staff work hard to provide an atmosphere where children feel safe to take risks and know that their efforts will be valued. Staff use TIS (Trauma Informed School) strategies and 'Brain Breaks' to prepare children for learning. Following our Golden Rules and high expectations of behaviour help maintain a positive climate for learning. (See also positive behaviour policy)

P - Picture your Learning

At the start of lessons teachers will specifically describe the **Learning Intention** - (To know... / To be able to... / To understand...) This will be supported with a list of component parts of the learning and requisite skills known as the 'Steps to Success'. Assessment for learning questioning techniques are used to check children's starting points and links are made to previous learning so that children's experiences are rooted in the familiar.

A - Accelerate your Learning

Through direct teaching and **modelling**, teachers demonstrate what successful outcomes look like. They clearly explain the task and the differentiated levels of challenge before checking that children are clear about the expectations and steps to success. Teaching has excellent pace and where possible is enriched with the use of IT.

R - Responsible Learning

Children are encouraged to challenge themselves but to be responsible learners who are able to recognise when they need support. Growth Mindset and a range of methods are used to ensure that all children are able to make progress from their starting points and extension activities are available for children who make rapid progress. Mini plenaries are used to consolidate or redirect learning where necessary. Choice and Challenge.

K- Knowing and Sparkling

What do you **know** now? Children evaluate their own work through self and peer assessment. They reflect on what exactly made the learning achievable and/or what barriers to accessing the learning still exist. Teachers use plenaries to celebrate Learning and Enjoy success, to consolidate learning and to look forward to the next steps to come.
