Our children are now busy being historians and writers with various topics underway ranging from discovering Stone Age Britain, The Great Fire of London to exploring 'The Titanic'. They used outdoor learning skills such as knot tying, using a 'flint and steel' to create a fire and wood skills to build drying and cooking racks.
