For younger children (4+) there will be a fun craft activity running alongside the conversation.


Let's come together to have a meaningful conversation about climate change and what we can do to make a difference in our community and enjoy some locally sourced food.


Last chance - Please send us your memories!



SEND Information

Our Brilliant Nurture Provision

As part of this series of half term newsletters, we continue to look at the support and provision on offer in our nurture provision. This week - **Lego Therapy** - something you could try at home!

Lego Therapy is a structured intervention which has been designed to develop communication and social skills within children.

The children take on different roles, having to work together following instructions to create a Lego model.

The roles include:

- **The engineer** reads and relays instructions to the supplier and builder
- The supplier locates the required Lego pieces and passes these to the builder
- **The builder** builds the model using pieces passed over by the supplier and following the instructions of the engineer.

The following skills develop during Lego Therapy: turn-taking; negotiating; listening; sharing; following instruction; collaborative problem solving; clear communication. I wonder who will take on which role in your family?
