We believe all children are unique and we strive to support every child equally to reach their potential. We place a high priority on the development of children's well-being as we know from research that positive well-being and engagement equates to deep-rooted learning. At St Day and Carharrack, we have an embedded child-centred approach to learning. The curriculum we offer provides prolonged periods of child-led play with a high emphasis on reading for pleasure and outdoor learning. Alongside a play- based approach, we teach children the skills they will need to be confident and enthusiastic speakers, readers, writers and mathematicians. Staff are experienced in supporting all children during play and adult-led sessions to be able to **Enjoy, Engage** and **Excel** in all opportunities.













| What happens for transition? When will they start full time?       | We would like to invite the children to visit our EYFS classroom this Summer term.  There will be three planned 'play and stay' visits.  Thursday 5 <sup>th</sup> June – 10.00am – 10.30am. Parents are welcome to stay for this session   |

|  | These visits give the children the opportunity to visit the EYFS learning environment and meet Miss Horne and teaching support staff.  |
|  | Starting School Sessions – Optional Support Sessions will be arranged for children to attend morning or afternoon sessions for the first week of school. This small group transition will enable your child to fully settle into our school. We have found this transition to be very successful and supportive. If you would like to take advantage of this, we can discuss this during your home visit or please do email us.  |
|  | Full Time Provision Our EYFS children will have their first full day in School (including lunch) on Thursday 4 <sup>th</sup> September 2025, at 8.30am   |

| My child has special educational needs, how will you support them? | We work closely with external agencies to meet every child's special and unique requirements. Educational Psychologists, Paediatricians, Speech and Language Therapists and other professionals work closely with the staff to provide the best outcomes for every child. Your child may require a Provision Map and you, as parent or carer, will be involved in every decision made about your child.  |
| What happens with lunches-my child can be quite a fussy eater?     | The children in school have a varied and balanced lunch choice in our dining hall. We ask that you order your child's lunch in advance (online) with your child so they know what they will be having. If there are any dietary requirements please let the school office know by 13 <sup>th</sup> June. Your child is allowed to bring in a lunch box from home if you do not wish them to have a school meal. The weekly menu is on our website so you can see which meals are on offer that day. ParentPay is our on-line booking system. A login will be sent to you once you have completed all the documents in your 'Admissions Information Pack' and returned them to the school office. |
