

Our Brilliant Nurture Provision

As part of this series of half term newsletters, we continue to look at the support and provision on offer in our nurture provision. This week - Fun Fit!

Fun Fit is a structured intervention which has been designed to develop children's posture and stability, coordination, controlled movements and balance. These are all required for children's gross motor skills, to help them with: running; riding a bike; jumping and hopping.

Activities to develop physical skills take place over a number of weeks and might involve practising:

- rolling
- throwing
- catching
- balancing using different equipment
- crossing over the midline
- kicking a ball
- · skipping, hopping, running
- climbing


