What a valuable insight into such an important part of life here in Cornwall!





News from around the school



Enjoying Maths

Why are multiplication tables so important to learn?


A recent study has concluded the learning of multiplication tables is essential for a child's future success in mathematics. Historical data collected from The Multiplication Check (a Year 4 statutory requirement) has shown a direct correlation between MTC scores and SATs results. Children scoring 19 or above (out of 25) on the MTC almost all achieved an Expected Standard Score in KS2 SATs. It is fair to say multiplication tables are a cornerstone of mathematics in both primary and secondary educational settings. Regular practice is key to securing and retaining these facts.
