Emerald Class had an exciting and immersive experience this week as we took part in an Egyptian workshop!

We were very lucky to be joined by Kate from the Royal Cornwall Museum, who brought along an incredible collection of artefacts for us to explore.

The highlight of the workshop was watching Kate demonstrate the ancient process of mummification. The children were fascinated as they learned about the different steps involved, from removing organs to wrapping the body in linen. It was a brilliant way to bring history to life!












We then had the opportunity to handle and examine artefacts that were thousands of years old. The children were amazed to think about the people who had used them so long ago.


To finish the workshop, we got creative by making our own bookmarks using real papyrus paper. The children carefully wrote their names in hieroglyphs, just as the Ancient Egyptians would have done.

It was a fantastic day full of hands-on learning, and we are so grateful to Kate and the Royal Cornwall Museum for sharing their knowledge with us!



Turquoise Class had the opportunity to visit the science labs at Redruth School to continue their learning about light and how we see. They were able to use ray boxes and prisms to split light and discover how light is made. The children measured different angles of light and were totally engaged for the whole lesson. The curiousity shown and the questions the children asked were excellent - a wonderful opportunity for our Year 6 to get a real feel for secondary school life in September.


















Athletics Tournament


