
A message from Ms Storey

Are you brave enough to take on the creative writing challenge?

Follow the instructions to complete a story with some very strange rules!

We will share some of your effort in assembly next week.

Creative Writing Challenge



Your mission is to write a short story about anything you choose. But there's a twist-you must follow these specific guidelines for each sentence:

Sentence 1: Include an eating **utensil** (e.g. knife, spoon, chopsticks, fork) Sentence 2: Begin with "**Despite**" and use between **10 and 14 words.** Sentence 3: Include a **musical instrument** (e.g. guitar, violin, piano). Sentence 4: Include a **country** (e.g. France, Kenya, Japan, Spain). Sentence 5: Include a **question**.

Sentence 6: Include slang (e.g., bruh, cap, drip, lit)

Sentence 7: Begin with "Without warning, Sentence 8: Write exactly 3 words.

Sentence 9: Include alliteration.



Alliteration is the repetition of the same initial consonant sound in two or more nearby
words. Example: Bright blue butterflies fluttered beautifully.


Sentence 10: Include a duck, princess, whale or cowboy.








Celebrating Attendance

eSafety Updates

We are sharing information this week about a game that is growing in popularity and, although aimed at older children, is likely to be something your children become aware of.

Marvel Rivals is a highly popular multiplayer shooter that pits iconic superheroes against formidable villains. The game is free -to play on PC and current-generation consoles but does feature microtransactions that allow players to spend real money on cosmetic items for their characters.

While Marvel Rivals has been deemed suitable for children aged 12 and over, there are several risks associated with the title that parents and educators should be aware of.

This free guide offers more information on these safety concerns and lets you know how to ensure that children playing the game can have a fun and age-appropriate experience.


