The TECgirls Cyber Guardians Club is an exciting 8-week adventure for girls in KS2. Through fun challenges, cool activities, and interactive lessons, they'll learn how to stay safe online, spot fake news, protect their privacy, and catch cyber threats. With inspiring role models and hands-on experience, the club is perfect for girls who love puzzles, escape rooms, and games! The programme wraps up with the Ultimate Cyber Guardians Challenge, where they'll put their skills to the test in an epic, team-based competition!











For the last 10 weeks, Sapphire class have been learning to play the ukulele. Originating in Portugal, this string instrument was adopted by the Hawaiians and has become their signature instrument. From learning to pluck and strum, Sapphire class have mastered a number of chords including C, C7, F and Am. They've thoroughly enjoyed all the brilliant songs we have learned from 'Coconut' by Harry Nilsson to 'The Best Day of Our Lives' by The American Authors.
