


Congratulations to all our Rock Super Stars on TTRS. A brilliant term of progress across year groups. A special mention to the children below for upleveling their rock star status in April.

This week, following some conversations in school around what children are accessing at home, we want to address unmonitored use of YouTube.

YouTube is a fantastic resource that is used across the world to enhance people's lives. However, it can also be a place where messages of intolerance and unkindness are shared.


It is incredibly important that all use of sharing sites such as YouTube is closely monitored by a responsible adult. As one video ends a new one, based loosely on the content of the previous one, will begin. If this isn't closely checked then the algorithm can get it wrong and before anyone realises children might be receiving messages that are inappropriate.

Please continue to set time and age limits on device use at home as well as making sure you know exactly what is being accessed.
