All our 'Stars' will celebrate their achievements with a hot chocolate break with Ms Storey.





News from around the school

As part of this series of half term newsletters, we continue to look at the support and provision on offer in our nurture provision. This week - **Well-being !**

Being mentally healthy and well is key to enable children to focus on their learning. In our well-being groups, we help children to recognise when their mental health might not be feeling so good and to identify what works for them to turn that around.

We use these lovely journals for our children in Key Stage 2 in our well-being groups. They are full of beautifully illustrated pages to help children learn about the importance of the following ways to help keep mentally healthy:

- Connecting with others - including animals
- Noticing the world around us - taking time to stop and do this
- Moving - exercising outdoors where possible
- Give to others
- Sleep and eat well
- Balance screen time with other activities
