




News from around the school - Sapphire Class

Refreshments will be available. All venues are wheel chair friendly.


Save the date - your children's learning will be on show - with categories for parental engagement - we would love to see what our children get up to out of school! The six different categories will be sent home this week.

We are all artists!

What inspires us this half term?



Sapphire class have stepped back in time, taking inspiration from ancient Roman pottery. They have learned about the different styles and techniques of pot making used by the Romans and have started to explore mark making in clay to replicate their intricate carvings. They will master different methods of joining clay pieces with slip to create their final masterpieces.

Turquoise class have been experimenting with abstract painting techniques, from splattering paint with a paintbrush to applying paint with household objects taking inspiration from the abstract backgrounds of Peter Thorpe. They will practise drawing from observation to create rockets and master blending two colours together to make seamless gradients for their planets before combining all three elements to make their final piece.
