














#### News from around the school- Emerald Class

#### New Science Topic- Rocks

This term, we started our new science topic on rocks, and the children showed great curiosity and enthusiasm. In our first lesson, we explored the similarities and differences between different types of rocks and their properties. To help us understand features such as layers, textures, and air pockets, we compared rocks to chocolate bars—spotting bubbles like those in a Wispa and layers similar to a Kit Kat. This hands-on approach really helped the children visualise how rocks can form in different ways.













# News from around the school- Emerald Class Remembrance Day

Emerald Class marked Remembrance Day with great thoughtfulness and respect. We began the morning by attending a special assembly, where the children learned about the significance of Remembrance Day and took part in a reflective silence. Back in the classroom, the children created their own thoughtful remembrance poems. They also used watercolours to paint beautiful poppy-themed backgrounds for their writing, taking great care with their artwork. We were very proud of the empathy and maturity the children showed throughout the day.















# News from around the school - Sapphire Class

Inspired by ancient Roman siege engines and war machines, Sapphire Class have been building models of catapults from lolly sticks and elastic bands in their design technology lessons. They had so much fun testing their firing power and comparing their designs with one another. In our next lesson, the children will get creative, changing various factors to try and improve the range of their catapult's shot. Some of the features they will experiment with will be the length of the catapult arm, the height of the base, the number of elastic bands and the tightness or the elastic bands. They will record their findings to create a list of instructions for building the perfect catapult. Have a go at making one at home by following the video tutorial below:

In Sapphire Class we all agree that we are so very lucky to live and learn in Cornwall. For the Made in St Day Christmas Fayre we decided to celebrate this with a Kana Kelyn themed ornament. Kana Kelyn is our favourite Christmas song to sing as a school and the children love to speak Kernewek (the Cornish language) in the chorus. Kana Kelyn translates to 'Sing Holly' so we have upcycled jar lids, paper scraps and old buttons to create these beautiful holly themed ornaments.

Parachute making was a real highlight. The children created four different designs to test airresistance and concluded which one would work best. PE has all been about bench ball. The games are fast, energetic and ultimately exciting. They are showing incredible teamwork as well as individual determination and resilience.

The children finished their involvement with the Plymouth Research Project and we will be updated in January with the findings. Teaching of Mastery in Maths continues to be a strong focus across the school. Every child, every day is accessing sessions to support their fluency, understanding and reasoning around number. The Principles of Mastery shape why we are engaging, whole school, in this new approach.


#### The Tall Tower
