# News from around the school - Enjoying, Engaging and Excelling Together!

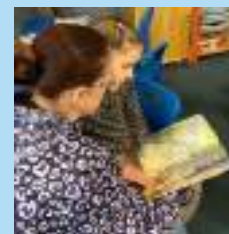

## Parent Engagement

As Year 4 children are fast approaching their Multiplication Tables Check, it is reassuring to know children are able to work out 144 multiplications by simply knowing 36 core facts. Take the fact  $4 \times 5 = 20$ . Children also know  $5 \times 4 = 20$ . Using their fluency knowledge, children know 8 is double 4 therefore double 20 is 40. With this understanding  $8 \times 5 = 40$  therefore  $5 \times 8 = 40$ . Multiplication is about finding patterns in maths. Over the Easter break, children in KS2 could learn these 36 core facts. Multiplications aren't just for Year 4. They reoccur throughout KS2, KS3 and even KS4!

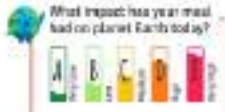
