Parent Partnerships - RRS Article 18 'Every Child, Every Day - a Reader and a Writer'

There can be few things as powerful as regularly reading with, and to your child. It has astonishing benefits for children: comfort, reassurance, confidence, relaxation, happiness and fun!

Reading everyday with your child will make a difference.

Alongside reading, writing is a vital skill needed to communicate in an ever changing world and we want all our children to see themselves as confident writers. We will work together with you to make this happen - every day. We achieved this with reading and we will do it with writing! Across our School, children have been learning 'book-making' skills. Why not make a zig-zag book together and try an idea below:

Look for writing when you are out and about and discuss the importance and different styles of writing. Make lists of favourite things, write the names of the people in your family or write about a family pet. Illustrate your ideas. Attendance

Please be aware of the latest government information on attendance that all schools must follow. You will receive our updated Attendance Policy and further information to support you next week.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996.

We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days. If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days. Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any threeyear period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs. Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs. Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.
