Emerald Class spoke about the importance of valuing each other by listening respectfully. All of the children participated in a word game where they had to listen to each other carefully.


"It is important to listen to each other so we can learn things about our friends"

Breakfast and Afterschool Wraparound Care

Breakfast and Afterschool Wraparound Care

We have received funding to extend our subsidised Childcare Provision from 8am until 6pm. Please enquire at the school office in the first instance.



Welcome to our Breakfast and Afterschool provision.

Many of our parents work and finding childcare can be difficult especially around school hours. We are aiming to provide a service which supports families to work. For this to remain viable we do need to break even.

We are very lucky to have an established Breakfast and Afterschool Wraparound Care, run by our own staff and situated in our beautiful Nurture Provision. We are delighted to be able to offer 8am – 6pm.

Our Wraparound Care offers some great activities, from outdoor games through to arts and crafts. Breakfast and Afterschool Wraparound Care includes healthy snacks and we ensure that the children are living our values of Enjoying, Engaging and Excelling and are well looked after until they can be picked up.

There are a maximum of 20 places available. To guarantee your child's place, all sessions need to be booked a week in advance and paid for via ParentPay. An initial school 'Wraparound Care Form' will also need to be completed. This can be found on our website or is available from the school office.

Sessions and Prices:

Breakfast Childcare Provision

Monday - Friday (term time only)

From 8am until the start of the school day - £3.50
This includes toast, cereals, pastries, fruit, yoghurts, breakfast bars, milk and fruit juice.

Afterschool Childcare Provision

Monday - Thursday (term time only)

From the end of the school day up to 4.30pm - £5.00 From the end of the school day up to 5.00pm - £7.00 From the end of the school day up to 6.00pm - £9.00 This includes healthy snacks and a drink

Friday (term time only)

From the end of the school day until 3.15pm – £5.00 This includes a healthy snack and a drink

Your child/ren must be collected promptly by the end of the session. If you run into the next session, you will be charged. If you arrive later than 6pm (or 3.15pm on Friday), there will be a late charge of £10.00. A (ruther £5.00 will be charged to your account for every 30 minutes or part therefore).

Children will only be admitted on an 'ad hoc' basis, if places are available and that payment for the session is paid on that day.

All sessions are non-refundable as staffing has already been allocated. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact the school office.


